


These past 20 months have allowed us at RADIUS to think more about how our programs, too, needed some reviving: from reflecting on the work we do in social innovation and systems change, we co-created new language to share the <u>what and how of our work</u>; as part of the Refugee Livelihood Lab, we launched our first-ever certificate program, the <u>Migrant Systems Change Leadership Certificate</u>; we hosted our first-ever <u>international RADIUS Fellowship</u>; we partnered with organizations, higher education institutions, not-for-profits, communities, municipalities, and ministries to <u>run equity-centred training</u>, <u>coaching</u>, and <u>solution labs</u>; we supported the development and delivery of the inaugural <u>Fireweed Fellowship</u> cohort, the first-ever national Indigenous Business Accelerator, alongside Raven Indigenous Capital Partners; and we were able to nationally share the <u>stories of the humans behind the Reimagine Health program</u>, part of our Health Promotion Lab. What an incredible year—and from the bottom of my heart, I thank each member of the RADIUS team and all of our participants and partners for their dedication, passion, and patience as we all continue our social innovation and systems change journeys. I hope we can continue to hold on to the optimism and get excited for what's next! I know I am!

Finishing the Inaugural Fireweed Fellowship

July saw the wrap-up of the <u>Fireweed Fellowship</u>, a nine-month program that brought together 23 Indigenous leaders in entrepreneurship and innovation in a decolonized space, created for those identifying as women (cis or trans), non-binary folx, 2 spirit, IndigiQueer etc.

What started as an entrepreneurship program soon became a culturally safe and healing space of community during a time of great uncertainty and loss. The Fellows came together to lift one another during times of hardship, and amplify each others' success during product launches and venture spotlights in the media. But more than that, through their unique lived experiences under a dominant culture that systematically oppresses and threatens their very existence, the Fireweed Fellows have found strength in each other. They recognize that their collective power is far greater than any one individual. They are the leaders of the new Indigenous economy; one that is more just and resilient, and one that works with the land, not against it.

TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION


Skookum Surrey: National Day for Truth and Reconciliation
